



# TECHNICAL SEO AUDIT CHECKLIST FOR WORDPRESS

A Practical Step-by-Step Worksheet for WordPress Site Owners

## HOW TO USE THIS CHECKLIST

Use this checklist while conducting a technical SEO audit for your WordPress site. Tick each item as you verify or fix it. Prioritize indexing and crawlability issues first before moving to optimization improvements.

### PHASE 1: CRAWLABILITY & INDEXATION

#### Robots.txt & Basic Configuration

- Robots.txt file exists and loads correctly
- No important pages accidentally disallowed
- XML sitemap referenced inside robots.txt
- "Discourage search engines" option is unchecked
- CSS and JS files are not blocked unintentionally

#### XML Sitemap Optimization

- Sitemap index is accessible
- Only indexable URLs included
- No 404 or redirected URLs inside sitemap
- Thin tag or archive pages excluded (if unnecessary)
- Sitemap submitted in Google Search Console
- Image data included properly
- Video sitemap created (if publishing original videos)

## **Index Coverage & Crawl Errors**

- Important pages are indexed
- No critical “Crawled – currently not indexed” issues
- Soft 404 errors reviewed
- Redirect issues resolved
- Duplicate without canonical issues fixed
- Robots.txt blocks reviewed

---

## **Internal Linking & Orphan Pages**

- Important pages linked internally
- No orphan blog posts
- Service pages linked in navigation
- Contextual links added within content
- Logical site hierarchy maintained

---

## **Index Bloat & Thin Content**

- Tag archives reviewed
- Author archives reviewed
- Date archives reviewed
- Attachment pages reviewed
- Internal search pages set to noindex
- Unnecessary parameter URLs controlled

---

## PHASE 2: PERFORMANCE & USER EXPERIENCE

### Page Speed & Core Web Vitals

- Page tested in PageSpeed Insights
- LCP optimized
- CLS minimized
- INP reviewed
- Images optimized
- Unused plugins removed
- Caching enabled (plugin/server/CDN)
- CSS & JS minified
- CDN configured (if applicable)

### Mobile-Friendliness

- Responsive layout verified
- Font readability checked
- Button spacing tested
- Mobile usability errors resolved

### HTTPS & Security

- SSL certificate active
- No mixed content warnings
- HTTP properly redirected to HTTPS
- WordPress core updated
- Themes & plugins updated
- Security issues checked in Search Console
- Manual actions checked

## PHASE 3: TECHNICAL STRUCTURE & OPTIMIZATION

### Duplicate Content & Canonical

- Canonical tags correctly implemented
- No conflicting canonical URLs
- HTTP/HTTPS versions consistent
- Parameter duplicates controlled

### Broken Links & Redirects

- Broken internal links fixed
- Broken external links updated
- Deleted pages redirected (301)
- No redirect chains
- No redirect loops
- 404 pages not redirected to homepage unnecessarily

### Pagination & Faceted Navigation

- Category pagination functioning correctly
- Filtered URLs controlled
- Canonical applied where needed
- Thin filtered pages no-indexed

### Structured Data & Schema

- Article schema validated
- Breadcrumb schema validated
- FAQ schema reviewed

---

- Organization schema implemented
- Rich Results Test passed
- No structured data errors in Search Console

---

## PHASE 4: ADVANCED TECHNICAL CHECKS

### JavaScript Rendering & Lazy Loading

- Important content visible in rendered HTML
- Lazy-loaded images indexable
- JS not hiding primary content
- URL Inspection tool tested

---

### Crawl Budget Optimization

- Crawl Stats reviewed
- Low-value URLs controlled
- No unnecessary archive crawling
- Noindex applied to unused archive types
- Log file analysis performed (if large site)

---

### International & Language Settings (If Applicable)

- Correct lang attributes
- Hreflang implemented properly
- Canonical and hreflang consistent
- No forced IP-based redirects
- Language switcher crawlable

---

## PRIORITY ORDER (FIX FIRST)

1. Indexing blocks (robots.txt / noindex)
2. Crawl errors
3. HTTPS & security
4. Performance issues
5. Duplicate content
6. Index bloat
7. Advanced checks

## FINAL NOTE

Run this technical SEO audit at least once every 3–6 months or after major WordPress updates, theme changes, or site migrations.
